#### Celebrating academic achievements

Naturally, Challenge has been a focus in the classroom and all of our prizewinners should be congratulated for their achievements over the year. Girls who worked hard towards external exams - IGCSEs, DELF, IELTS and Advanced Placement exams - deserve particular mention. This is the second year we have delivered Advanced Placement courses, university-level courses designed to challenge students beyond High School level. The AP students were rewarded with strong results for their efforts. All three subjects in which students took AP courses this year at Surval - English, History and Art - recorded their strongest results yet with a particularly outstanding Grade 5 from Katya in her Art AP - only 6,4% of students taking AP Art achieve this top grade which bears testament to Katya's hard work and incredible creative talent.

All Grade 12 students have worked hard during the year to achieve their High School Diploma and meet the requirements for their university applications.

Congratulations to Grade 12 for achieving offers at their chosen universities:


- Fashion Design at Parsons College of Art and Design, Paris

As students work toward their college and career goals, it's important to build in opportunities to document and reflect on their progress. In English class, we achieve this using portfolio-based assessments. Throughout the year, students built a website showcasing their best work from each unit then wrote reflections on the qualities of their work. This not only required students to engage in self-feedback on their work but also challenged them to use digital tools to build engaging websites to document their progress. Luisa in grade 10 created a highly effective digital portfolio, and in reflecting on her final essay wrote, "I used an advanced vocabulary with the goal of making my essay more interesting and complete and I believe the goal was met. I used clear quotations which helped me when making my point clear. The thesis I used was effective and memorable which makes the reader interested in the topic. I did a really good job when analyzing the quotes and reflecting on them. I feel I did my best and I am really happy of how my hard work is reflected in it."

My biggest challenge was keeping up with all of the work I had to do and making sure that it was good quality work. Since it was my senior year, I had to do a lot of university preparation as well as complete my APs well.

The event, entitled "A Bridge to Hope" raised over CHF 1'000.- for EVAM and the Domaine Foyer Montreux, a local charity supporting refugees, with the money specifically going to equip an activity room for Ukrainian children.
